





Fourth edition of the Ferrara Bible published in Amsterdam in 1646. Reprint made from the third printed edition of 1630, both reviewed and corrected by the famous Portuguese typographer and teacher at the Portuguese Hebrew community of Amsterdam, Menasseh Ben Israel. The famous Ferrara Bible or Sephardic Bible was translated from Hebrew to Ladino (dialect of Castilian used by the Sephardim) and printed in Ferrara in 1553 by the famous Portuguese printer Abrão Usque (whose Christian name was Duarte Pinhel), brother of Samuel Usque (author of "Consolação às Tribulações de Israel") sponsored by Yom Tob Atias (Christian name Geronimo de Vargas Hespanhol).







During the years of this trip there was an ongoing the conflict between Portugal and Argentina for the possession of the current territory of Uruguay, a conflict that aroused the interest of North America whose presidents, since independence, began to defend a political thesis that would tend, in the medium term, to declare that North America did not admit interference from European powers throughout America, and subsequently led to the formulation of the Monroe Doctrine, on the 2nd December 1823, creating the foundations of American isolationism and the profound influence of North America throughout the American continent. Brackenridge provides an enthusiastic description of Rio, studies manners and customs, provides statistics and comments on the political situation. São Paulo, Santa Catariana and Rio Grande do Sul are described in a separate chapter. The work provides, in more than a hundred pages, important and accurate details about the country. The rest of the book contains a treatise on the province of Rio da Prata.



As the author explains in his preface, the publication was prompted by the appearance of the spectacular and unusually bright comet of November 1618, which was still visible in January 1619. Work dedicated to Marino Gethaldo and divided into 5 "books" which deals with the astronomical theories of Copernicus, Brahe, Kepler, Galileo and others. This work is replete with curious information, and we find in the mention of a sort of telescope (or perspicillum) used it is said, by Pope Leo X at the beginning of 16th century The important issue of this scarce work comes from the new concept of paralaxe, according to which the author assumes for the first time that comets are effectively celestial bodies, opposite to the previous opinion of Galileo.

Illustrated with the coat of arms of Dom Rodrigo da Cunha, which occupies three-quarters of the title page, with helmet, topped with a winged dragon and framed by a mantle made up of branches, which spread over the shield. The copy has a manuscript ownership title with caligraphy from the early 18th-century at the foot of the title page (D. Tivisco[?] Gomez Piñero. Anno 1710.) and a signature in contemporary handwriting at the end of the dedication, (RuFran.cisco[?] de Valverde) on the front of folio 2.

The Lusiads is the greatest epic poem of the Renaissance. With ten cantos composed of octaves, stanzas of eight decasyllable verses, it extols the deeds of the Portuguese (the Lusíadas), which culminated in the discovery of the sea route to India and the establishment of total domination of the Indian Ocean for a century. The narrative of the journey is embellished by the use of classical mythology and other narratives inserted, describing the History of Portugal and famous episodes for their intense drama and lyricism, such as the one of the Giant Adamastor or that of Inês de Castro, being preceded by a magnificent dedication to King D. Sebastião and closed by a brilliant final exhortation to the young king.

The author writes anonymously, using the legendary personality of Thomas Ercildoune: a Scottish bard who lived in the Middle Ages, around the years 1220-1298. He is also known as Thomas the Rhymer or True Thomas, who is considered in legends as a prophet, and as having had an intimate relationship with the Fairy Queen, Titania, considered by the British anthropologist, Sir James Frazer, to be the English version of Diana or Artemis, the goddess of the forests and wildlife. A photo pictorial book. Work inspired by the romantic history of Portugal and the idyllic landscapes, forests and woodlands in the region of Sintra, hereby adopted by the imaginary of the 19th century English literature and legends. The original photographs illustrating this work are the first to register the various buildings and mystical gardens built in Sintra - by Gerard de Visme, Francis Cook, King Ferdinand II and the Countess of Edla - and particularly the Palace of Monserrate.



The whole of Exemplary Novels is considered to be his most important and notable work after D. Quixote.

The work contains various anecdotes about historical characters and events, unusual books, and the habits of book-collectors. The work was very popular and sold widely in the 19th century. Isaac D'Israeli (1766? - 1848) was a British writer, scholar, and man of letters. He is best known for his essays, his associations with other men of letters, and as the father of British Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli.

This book is an oracle of apocalyptic reform in early 16th Century, about a demon-infested world in perilous times. After the study of Michael Dean Milway (The Burden and the Beast an Oracle of Apocalyptic Reform in early sixteenth-century Salzburg) the reform and apocalypse were one and the same. Apocalypticism grew deepest on the margins of society among radical sectarians. The anticlericalism and apocalyptic world in the author of Onus Ecclesiae was a preparation for reform, not only as a manifestation of discontent but a reaction and a prelude to Reformation. 



It has known great success and had numerous editions in several languages. Many apothegms repeated ideas of Socrates, Plato, and Alexander the Great.

This Album gathers a set of pictures of Rio de Janeiro, being a unique document for the history of ther city and for the history of photography.

Gutierrez is considered the father of war and photo journalism in Brazil. The iconographic photos of the Naval Revolts are part of the cultural heritage recognized by Unesco. His work is of utmost importance for the history of Brazil and Latin America.

Contains high definition photos (mostly in black and white) printed in matte paper and most of them developed in the best photography houses at the time: Instanta and Fotocolor in Lisbon. This photo collection is of utmost importance for the study of hunting and ecology both in Portugal and Africa, depicting natural regions and parks with fauna that today is already extinct or protected. The photos show the species in their natural habitats and large nature overviews, this being interesting for the biology and the ecology of the regions where the hunts took place. Also with high ethnographic interest, there are several images of local populations taken in Angola and Morocco.

Freitas refutes "Mare Liberum", a work published in 1608, in Holland, by the famous Dutch jurist Hugo Grotius. The work of Grotius was initially written to legally legitimize the famous 1603 act of piracy by Dutch privateers serving under the East India Company.

In 1635 John Selden publishes "Mare Clausum Seu De Dominio Maris" defending the British interests due to the King wanting to prohibit the Dutch fishermen to fish in British waters, thus having the controversy gained a new importance.

A work consisting of 7 " Classis " [Treatises], or 7 classes of medical knowledge, having been added in this ninth edition, from the luntas in Venice, with spurious books, fragments and commentaries by Galen and his commentators, and also a volume with Brasavola's index.

The work of the Greco-Roman physician Galen was considered the true and most important source of medical knowledge for more than fifteen centuries. Galen considered that nerves are connected to the brain, either directly or through the spinal cord. He correctly predicted the effect of cutting the phrenic nerve, which controls the diaphragm in breathing; he checked the compass value of pulsations, and the response to emotional stresses; he demonstrated that the kidneys process urine and showed that arteries contain blood, not water.

Its main contribution to Portuguese medicine was the lexicographic fixation of medical terminology of dermatological diseases. In the preface the author clarifies the reason for the publication, as well as the criteria and method he used for its creation, terminology, compilation, adaptation and correction of the works of universal authors of reference on dermatology, both ancient and contemporary, comparing them with the observations he made himself in Lisbon, on the trip to Rio de Janeiro, with a stopover on the island of Madeira, where he collected data and also in his stay in Rio de Janeiro.

When Keye first published his work in Dutch in 1659, both regions were under Dutch colonial control, but in 1664 the British took New Amsterdam and renamed it New York, gaining control over what had been The New Netherlands. 





The manuscript title on spine in roughly classical Arabic translates (possibly) into: "Second Volume of the Book of Enlightenment."

This is one of the greatest books by a European traveler in the East and is a classic of Portuguese literature. Mendes Pinto's work is a forerunner of the Orientalism and Exoticism very much in vogue in the 19th and 20th centuries, but it has the superiority of not having only a touristic, distanced aspect, characteristic of the referred

tendencies. On the contrary, it has an approach of great intelligence, sensibility and receptivity to these new civilizations. The Peregrinação includes numerous indirect criticisms of the mentality and negative behaviours of the Portuguese.

Girolamo Mercuriale (1530 -1606) was an Italian physician, most famous for his work De Arte Gymnastica. Born in the city of Forlì, the son of Giovanni Mercuriali, also a doctor, he was educated at Bologna, Padua and Venice, where he received his doctorate in 1555. In Rome, he made favorable contacts and had free access to the great libraries, where with great enthusiasm, he studied the classical and medical literature of the Greeks and Romans. His studies of the attitudes of the ancients toward diet, exercise and hygiene and the use of natural methods for the cure of disease culminated in the publication of his De Arte Gymnastica (Venice, 1569). In 1573, he was called to Vienna to treat the Holy Roman

Emperor Maximilian II. The emperor, pleased with the treatment he received (although he was to die three years later), made him an imperial count palatine. He returned home in the following years; in 1575, the Venetian Senate awarded him a six-year contract as a professor at the University of Padua. Although he was largely hailed as a hero of

the city, his reputation would take a sharp turn downwards after his inept handling of the outbreak of plague in Venice in 1576-1577. However, Mercuriale salvaged his own reputation in the following years with the 1577 publication of De Pestilentia, his treatise about the plague, which had been delivered as a series of lectures at the University of Padua. He remained in Padua until 1587, when he began teaching at the University of Bologna. In 1593, he was called by Ferdinando di Medici, the Grand Duke of Tuscany, to Pisa. Cosimo wanted to increase the prestige of the university and offered a record salary of 1,800 gold crowns, to become 2,000 gold crowns after the second year. Mercuriale returned to Forlì in 1606 and died there few months later.



He establishes a great analogy with the seduction of the melopoeiasof Asian cultures, justifying it with the fact that the artist populates his decorative motifs with idealised and evocative representations of women, flowers, stars, birds, and beautiful fabrics with great balance and harmony. This magnificent work is one of the finest examples of the Art Nouveau style, a

beautiful showcase of the art of Alphonse Mucha in his most productive period between 1895 and 1905, which had a profound influence on the art and design of the 20th and 21st centuries. The very elaborate drawings in this work, placed in rectangles, triangles, stars, circles, and irregular geometric shapes, show examples of the way in which arabesques, vegetal motifs, natural forms and, in particular, women and children could be used in the decoration and ornamentation of objects, within the canons of Art Nouveau. The book dates from the time when the author was a teacher at the Académie Colarossi, teaching a course that enabled students to produce artistic decorations applied to decorative panels, windows, porcelain, enamels, lacquers, furniture, jewellery, and posters.





The photo collection starts with a collective portrait of the officers of the Gloucester Regiment's 1st battalion taken in Ladysmith shortly before the war (September 29th, 1899). At the end of the album 7 photos related to the regiment's early service in India, and include both official and family portraits. In the core the album contains a number of portraits of distinguished Boer leaders and military commanders, including Petrus Jacobus Joubert (1834-1900), Lucas Meyer, Louis Botha (1862-1919), Daniel Jacobus Erasmus (1830-1913), General Snyman (1838-1925), and Pieter Arnoldus Cronjé (1836-1911). Many photos in the album were taken by important local photo studios, both Boer (J. Van Hoepen, Stoel & Groote) and British (Spratt Photo, Barnett & Co).




Very Rare manuscript and very important for the study of this chronicle by Rui de Pina and for the realization of a critical edition. In the future it will be necessary to compare it with other manuscript copies existing in several libraries, namely the BNP which has at least 8 copies, (see below). It is also due to the fact that this chronicle was very well known and read, in manuscript copies, before the 1st edition was printed in 1790, the great influence it had on the historical view of the events it narrates,

namely the traumatic death in combat of the Infante D. Pedro, at Alfarrobeira, on 29 May 1449, during the short Civil War between the Infante's supporters and the supporters of the young king Afonso V, including the Duke of Bragança, as well as the rise, after the Battle of Toro, of Prince João, the future king João II. The present chronicle was the first one he wrote, at the warrant of King João II, between about 1481 and 1485.



This set of laws was printed in 1780 and 1786 in St. Petersburg and is the reprint of the general laws of the Admiralty Council of the Tsar Peter the Great (1672-1725) who initially ordered it to be printed in one volume at the Imperial Print House in 1722. This was followed by two volumes of the Regulations of the Navy mainly about the operation of the crews aboard the ships, at sea and on land, in peace or at war. These laws came up at the time the Russian administrative and political system were being modernised by Peter the Great, who intended to end the feudal state. With that goal he created a bureaucratic state, not depending on just one lord. He promoted a modern State functioning under collegial bodies controlled by imperial [political] commissioners, supervised by judges and public prosecutors, and supported by a comprehensive job and task description.



This edition of the Treatise of the Sphere contains a scientific compilation by Francisco Junctino Florentio as well as comments of Elias Vineti about the ancient concepts of the sphere. The last chapter contains comments of Pedro Nunes on Sacrobosco about climates, describing the differences at the several latitudes, published still while Pedro Nunes was alive, and adapted by Elias Vineti. It also contains the Compendium of the Sphere by Pedro Valeriano Bellunensem, with its own frontispiece on page 147. The Sphaera of Sacrobosco (1195-1256) was essencial for the development of European seafaring, and has been largelly copied as a manuscript during the Middle Ages. It was one of the first scientific works to be printed in the first years of printing. Its first edition dates from 1472 and, after that, was published over 200 times until the 18th century. In this edition, printed by Giunta and expanded by the mathmatician Élie Vinet, was written as a book for students of mathematics and geometry.





This is the first treatise on ophthalmic surgery printed in Portugal and is illustrated with the surgical instruments and the image of a doctor operating on a patient. It demonstrates a degree of scientific knowledge and collects information from the most famous ophthalmologists (from Germany, England and France) and from auxiliary sciences, filling a gap that had existed until then. Dr. Santa Anna died in 1814, having the glory of being the first ophthalmologist in Portugal to raise this branch of medicine to a previously unknown level.


Very rare 1st edition of this juridical work on international law on the freedom of commerce and on the right to navigate in international waters without the deterrence strategy intended by many countries (as Holland) to discourage their adversaries to compete on the old usual maritime routes to Western and Eastern Indies.

The text is printed in Latin and with several notes across the book in Greek, Hebrew/Chaldaic, and Arabic. This controversy generated a discussion around Europe on the rights acquired by the Portuguese due to the Discoveries. The several papal bulls granted in favour of «Mare Clausum» and mainly of the free circulation of goods and capitals around the world considerably influenced the "Rights of the People". The controversy gained

a new importance when, in 1635, John Selden publishes this work "Mare Clausum Seu De Dominio Maris", defending the English interests when the King decided to forbid Dutch fishermen to fish in British waters. "Mare Clausum" was probably the most widely read of all of Selden's treatises. The work discusses the issue of the dominion of the seas. The title, translated literally from Latin, means enclosed sea, in pointed opposition to the work Mare Liberum, or free sea, published by Hugo Grotius in 1609.

Work containing the first coeval History of Mexico and its conquest. Third edition of this valuable literary, historical and typographic work by the chronicler of the King of Spain between 1661-1686, first published in 1684. Printed in double columns all numbered. Solis says (see Chap. II) that previous chroniclers had not treated the History of Mexico separately from other achievements, joining, as happened in the Antonio Herrera's First and Second

Decades; and in the History of Peru by Garcilaso Inca; confirming that these two authors had not known Mexico with approach, dealing only with minor matters, without consistency in their news. Also the story of Bernal Diaz del Castillo, kept long in manuscript and printed with gaps, has loss of information and has been taken as scattered, so Antonio Solis joined "Relaciones and Papers", from public and private archives, to form a reliable narration.


